Launch of Inaugural issue of Asian Journal of International Law

The *Asian Journal of International Law* is a twice-yearly publication of the Asian Society of International Law. It publishes peer-reviewed scholarly articles (8,000 to 12,000 words excluding footnotes) and book reviews (up to 1,000 words including footnotes) on public and private international law. The regional focus of the *Journal* is broadly conceived. Some articles may focus specifically on Asian issues; others will bring one of the many Asian perspectives to bear on issues of global concern. Still others will be of more general interest to scholars, practitioners, and policy-makers located in or working on Asia.

The *Journal* is published in English as a matter of practical convenience rather than political endorsement. English-language reviews of books in other languages are particularly welcomed. Abstracts of selected articles in other Asian languages will be posted on the *Journal's* website.
